The Advisory Board consists of 12-15 community members who inform and influence the Executive Board decisions on resource allocation, policy recommendations, and program development as it relates to affordable housing.

To do this the Advisory Board meets monthly on the first Thursday of the month from 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm.

Advisory Board members are appointed by the SKHHP Executive Board to a four-year term with service limited to a total of two consecutive terms. Members that are not able to serve the full four-year appointment may opt out at any time.




