Who We Are

Formed in 2019 by an Interlocal Agreement, we are a collaboration between 10 South King County cities and King County united under the common goal to ensure the availability of housing for all income levels of residents in South King County. We achieve this through a focus on the production and preservation of affordable housing, partnership with public and private organizations, pooling and sharing resources, and advancing housing policies.

Purpose

Create a coordinated, comprehensive, and equitable approach to increasing housing stability, reducing homelessness, and producing and preserving quality affordable housing in South King County.



The Advisory Board consists of 12-15 community members who inform and influence the Executive Board decisions on resource allocation, policy recommendations, and program development as it relates to affordable housing.

To do this the Advisory Board meets monthly on the first Thursday of the month from 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm.

Advisory Board members are appointed by the SKHHP Executive Board to a four-year term with service limited to a total of two consecutive terms. Members that are not able to serve the full four-year appointment may opt out at any time.

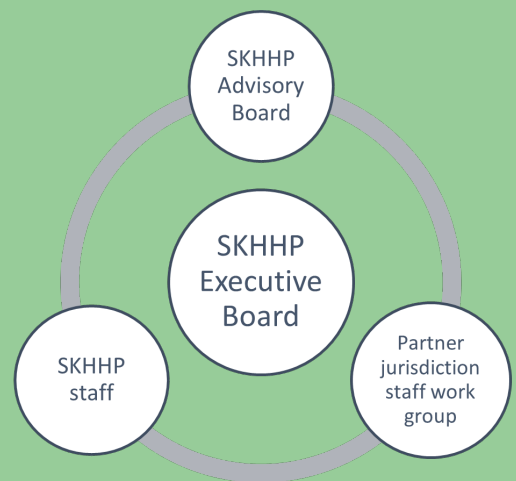
Personal and/or professional affiliation with the following communities:

- Learn about housing issues impacting the South King County region, and provide an opportunity to empower voices from the community
- Support community engagement and education around the topics of housing and homelessness
